



Care Instructions

Fatsia Japonica / Japanese Aralia

Location:

* Outdoor in part shade to shade. Eastern exposure with morning sun is best. Full sun would burn the leaves.

As a tropical plant, bring it back indoors when the temperatures drop below 12 degrees Celsius.

* Indoor in part shade to shade

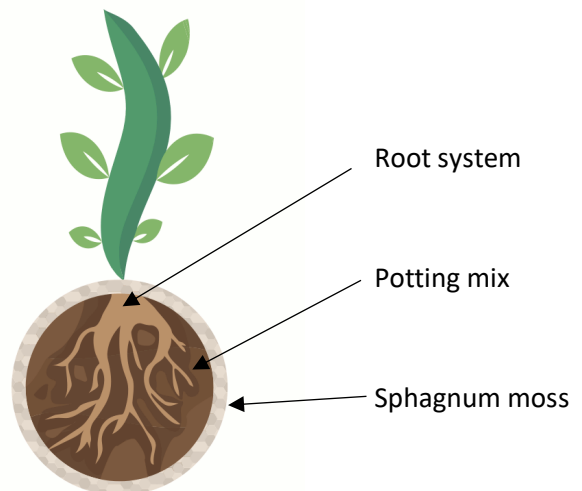
Fatsia may be pruned annually to maintain a bushy growth habit and healthy, glossy leaves. Either cut the entire plant to the ground in late winter just before new growth begins, or you remove one-third of the oldest stems each year for three years.

Watering:

As a rule of thumb, water your kokedama once a week or when it feels light. Adapt the watering depending on the temperature and the ambient humidity: water less frequently in cooler months, more frequently in warmer month. Windy and hot conditions tend to dry the moss ball quicker. Keep the moss ball moist (but not soggy) at all times by watering it from the top once it feels lighter and is half dry. Don't wait for the moss ball to be totally dry to water. In winter, space waterings a bit more.
